

## E4 People WHS Induction for Agency Healthcare Staff

**Welcome to E4 People.** You are now an employee of E4, and your safety and wellbeing are fundamental to everything we do.

As a labour hire worker in the healthcare sector - aged care, hospitals, or remote health clinics - this induction ensures you understand:

- Your legal duties under the **Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (NSW)**
- Risks associated with healthcare work
- Safe work practices and infection prevention
- Emergency procedures and incident reporting
- Key contacts for support at E4 and your host site

**Note:** This induction complements your host site induction and applies to all placements. You must complete both before starting work.

### Your WHS Responsibilities - Legal Obligations

Under SafeWork NSW, all workers, including labour hire staff, must:

- Take reasonable care of your own health and safety
- Not put others at risk through your actions or omissions
- Follow reasonable instructions, policies, and procedures from your host employer and E4 People
- Report hazards, incidents, and near misses immediately

These duties apply in all workplaces, including hospitals, aged care, remote clinics, and outreach sites.

### Your rights include:

- A safe working environment
- The right to refuse unsafe work (Section 84, WHS Act)
- Consultation on health and safety matters
- Access to training and information
- Raising concerns without fear of retaliation

You also have a duty to cooperate with health and safety policies.

### Common Hazards in Healthcare Work

#### Aged Care

- Manual handling / musculoskeletal injury
- Resident aggression or confusion (e.g., dementia-related behaviour)
- Infectious diseases (gastro, flu, COVID-19)
- Slips, trips, and falls

### Hospitals

- Sharps / needlestick injuries
- Hazardous substances or medications
- Fatigue from long shifts or high-acuity work
- Cross-infection between wards or patients

### Remote & Regional Work

- Lone work or isolated travel
- Limited immediate access to emergency services
- Environmental hazards
- Cultural safety risks in diverse communities (More details can be found in our Travel Nurses Handbook)

### Managing Risks

Follow SafeWork NSW's four-step risk management process:

1. **Identify hazards**
2. **Assess risks**
3. **Control risks**
4. **Review controls**

What you should do:

- Follow safe work procedures
- Use PPE correctly and consistently
- Report hazards, broken equipment, or unsafe behaviour
- Ask for help if unsure
- Take breaks to manage fatigue

### Infection Prevention & Control (IPC)

Effective IPC protects you, your colleagues, and the people you care for.

You must:

- Perform hand hygiene before and after every task
- Use PPE correctly (gloves, masks, gowns, eye protection, respirators)
- Dispose of waste and sharps safely
- Follow outbreak, isolation, and cohorting procedures
- Report symptoms or exposure immediately

Do not attend work if you are unwell or exposed to infectious disease.

### Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

The host organisation provides appropriate PPE and instructions.

If PPE is:

- Missing
- Unsuitable
- Damaged or does not fit

You must:

1. Stop work immediately if unsafe
2. Notify your host supervisor
3. Contact E4 People before continuing work

## Vaccinations

Vaccinations reduce infection risk and protect vulnerable people. Many placements require immunisations.

You are responsible for:

- Providing evidence of vaccination before placement
- Keeping records current
- Following site-specific requirements during outbreaks

## Emergency Procedures

Every site has an emergency plan. You must know:

- How to raise the alarm
- Evacuation routes and assembly points
- Fire/emergency wardens
- How to support residents/patients

**Remote workers:** Know communication systems (radio, satellite phone) and duress protocols.

## Incidents, Hazards & Reporting

All incidents, hazards, and near misses must be reported to **both the host site and E4 People**.

**Examples:**

- Medical emergency → Call 000, follow host procedures, notify E4 People
- Aggression or violence → Remove yourself, follow host procedures, report to E4 People
- Sharps injury → Follow exposure protocol, report to host and E4 People

**Reporting Steps:**

1. Notify your host supervisor or site contact
2. Complete site-specific forms
3. Contact your E4 People consultant or WHS contact
4. Provide details of what happened, where, and when

5. Seek medical attention if required

### **Fatigue, Stress & Remote Work**

Healthcare work can be physically and mentally demanding.

#### **You are expected to:**

- Present fit for work and rested
- Take scheduled breaks
- Manage sleep, hydration, and nutrition
- Notify E4 People if fatigue affects safety

#### **Remote work:**

- Regular check-ins and emergency contacts will be provided
- Report concerns about isolation, travel, or environment immediately

You may refuse unsafe work if fatigue, environment, or support gaps make it unsafe.

### **Respect & Psychological Safety**

Everyone deserves a safe and respectful workplace.

You have the right to:

- Be treated with dignity, fairness, and respect
- Work free from bullying, harassment, discrimination, and victimisation
- Raise concerns without fear of reprisal

#### **Unacceptable behaviour includes:**

- Bullying, harassment, sexual harassment
- Offensive comments, unwelcome contact, threats

E4 People have zero tolerance for inappropriate behaviour. Substantiated incidents may result in removal from placement.

### **Refresher Training**

You may request refresher training if:

- You have not performed a task recently
- You move into a new or higher-risk setting
- You feel unsure of your competency
